As a responsible supplier, we would like to make our customers aware of some details regarding our packaging products. This is a legal requirement under the Environment Agency's Packaging Waste Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) Regulations.

#### **Return and collection systems**

There is no return system for our packaging. Customers should consult with their local authority or an accredited waste service provider for details on local recycling availability and waste collection systems.

#### Our role in reusing and recycling packaging and packaging waste

Recycling helps to save energy, avoid landfill and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Where possible, we reuse our packaging. This is done in many ways, including:

- Reusing inbound cardboard cartons and pallet boxes
- Reusing inbound wooden crates and pallets
- Breaking down unusable crates and pallets to provide 'stiffening material' for long items such as door locks
- Shredding unusable cardboard and paper items for use as packing material

We are also in the process of re-designing the packaging of many own-brand items in order to negate the need to put them into additional outer cartons for onward shipment.

Any packaging material that cannot be re-used in any of the ways described above is sent away for recycling or disposal (whichever applies) by an accredited waste service provider.

# Our customers' role in reusing and recycling packaging and packaging waste

Recycling helps to save energy, avoid landfill and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Where possible, our customers should reuse our packaging. If you have to dispose of it, we encourage you to recycle as much as possible, using an accredited waste service provider.

All of our cardboard is recyclable. Our VBH/Q-secure/greenteQ packing tape can also be recycled. Most of our plastic packaging used at despatch (e.g. tape) contains at least 30% recycled material. We are unable to confirm that 100% of the plastics used for packaging at the factories (e.g. inner bags for handles, cylinders etc.) can be recycled, so this should be disposed of as waste. We will continue to work with the factories to improve upon this situation in the future.
